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1. INTRODUCTION

This Annual Report on the working of the University is prepared by the Executive Council for presentation to the General Council in pursuance of the requirement under Section 12 (2) (iii) (a) of the National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam Act,2009.

The period covered is the calendar year from January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020.

Academics Under Extraordinary Circumstances

A. Background

The cataclysmic outbreak of Covid-19 across the globe, and the concomitant closure of Universities since March 15, 2020 has interposed some challenges to the smooth conduct of academic life. Notwithstanding the constraints spurted by the exigent circumstances, the University has persevered to stay the course.

B. Academic Activities

No sooner had the University shut down, in abidance with government orders on the matter, than the University had directed all faculty members to deliver instructional guidelines and study materials to the students through email. Further, faculty members were directed to share power-point presentations on course modules with concerned students to supplement remote learning. To keep a tab on the teacher-student interactions, the instructional materials were to be e-mailed to the University's Examination Section for onward transmission to the intended recipients.

Furthermore, to optimize digital interface between the teacher and the taught, the University has registered itself with Google Classroom, an online platform recommended by the UGC. The instant platform has been actively explored by teachers to conduct classes, interact with their students and share study material on modules thus delivered. In this regard, it may be mentioned that some faculty members have optimally explored social media platform such as YouTube to record and upload their lectures on important course modules.

The Even Semester of Academic Year 2019-2020 and the Odd & Even Semester of Academic Year 2020-2021 have been/is being conducted successfully in the online mode and

examinations held in the online mode/through assignments in accordance with BCI and UGC guidelines on the same.

C. Resumption of on-Campus Activities

Subsequent to issuance of UGC guideline in November, 2020 permitting Universities to commence on-campus academic activities for research scholars and final year students and release of SOP/guidelines by Govt. of Assam on resumption of on-campus activities from December 15, 2020, the University has recommenced on-campus residency and classes in the blended online-offline mode for students of B.A.,LL.B (Hons.) Five Year Integrated Course, Vth Year and One Year LL.M Degree Programme, on voluntary basis



4.5.3 Activities of Important Committees

4.5.3.1 The Disciplinary Committee

The Convener, along with the members of the Committee, has constantly been on alert to keep strict vigilance on matters related to maintaining the discipline in the campus. The Committee has been keeping an eye on all activities in the campus. Violation of any rules or sanctity of the University is strongly dealt with by the Disciplinary Committees for Boys and Girls.

4.5.3.2 The Unfair Means and Malpractice Committee

The University's persistent efforts to promote and preserve integrity in all academic pursuits is reflected in the perceptively reduced number of cases of malpractice and / or unfair means reported during the period under report.

The Committee undertakes surprise visits during examinations to keep a strict vigil on any unfair means and / or malpractice adopted by the students. The University is equipped with Anti-Plagiarism software which examines all the project reports and the dissertations submitted by the students. The software filters the contents of the project reports and the dissertations in accordance with the standards of National Law University, Assam Academic Misconduct Regulations.

In the present pandemic impacted academic session, the University has administered proctored online examinations, with view to persevering with academic sanctity even under compelling conditions.

4.5.3.3 The Internal Complaints Committee

The Internal Complains Committee (ICC) has been constituted in accordance with the UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students in Higher Education Institutions) Regulations, 2016. The ICC probes into complaints on sexual harassment of women at workplace. The University makes an all-out effort to maintain a gender sensitive academic environment.

No case has been reported to ICC in the year 2020.

5.4 USER SERVICES AND FACILITIES

5.4.1 Infrastructure



The NLUJA, Assam Library has transposed to its newly erected permanent building, which is located in the heart of the NLUJA, Assam Campus, Amingaon. The state of the art library building is a four storied (ground plus three) magnificent building spreading across a wide area of approximately 50,000 sq. ft. NLUJA, Assam Library is a fully air conditioned, CCTV and Wi-Fi enabled building which is accoutred with RFID system for smooth functioning of its services. The library has an exclusive digital library section housed in the second floor of the building, allowing its users to access high quality resources of the library. The library has approximately twenty thousand print collections housed in different sections, namely, Law textbook section, Social Science section, Reference Section and Back Volume Section located in the ground floor, first floor and third floor respectively of the library building, along with sufficient reading space. The library is rich in terms of hardware infrastructure and owns BookEye 4 Scanner, SureBind Systems 2 Strip Binders, Kindle Paperwhite, Self-Issue Return Kiosk, Self-

Book Drop Unit, OPAC Kiosk in each floor, and such other modern amenities.

5.4.2 Subscription of Anti-Plagiarism Software

As mandated by UGC, the NLUJA, Assam Library subscribes to Urkund anti-plagiarism software (provided by INFLIBNET) as well as Turnitin from Turnit India Pvt. Ltd. with the provision for individual accounts for students and faculty members to check the similarity index of their scholarly papers.

5.4.3 Library Orientation Programme 2020

Library Orientation Programmes have been conducted online on November 4 - 5, 2020 for newly admitted students of B.A., LL.B FYIC and One year LL.M Degree Programme, to make them aware about the holdings, facilities and services of the University Library. The orientation session delivered brief information about the printed and electronic resources, facilities and services of the Library, followed by a virtual tour of the Library. Library accounts for the fresh students were generated online at the end of the session.

6.1 Placements

In order to beef-up on campus placement of students, a placement Facilitating Committee has been set up by the University, which has mentored the outgoing batches. Several recruiters have evinced interest in visiting the University in order to conduct on premise placements. Under the prevailing constraints, the University is endeavouring to create a vibrant online placement mechanism. Encapsulated information on the students' academic as well as extra-

mural activities, *viz.* Moot Court Competitions, Debates, Mediation and Negotiation Competition, Judgment Writing Competition, Model United Nations and participation in various national and international conferences, is circulated among prospective recruiters with the intent to woo them to online placement ventures.

7. CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

7.1. PROJECTS COMPLETED

A. Library Building





The Library of NLUJA, Assam has been relocated to the newly constructed Library Building in the month of August 2020. The new Library Building is an octagonal, G+3 RCC building. The ground floor, first floor and third floor of the Library Building are used for stacking and reading purposes. Second floor of the Library Building houses a digital library with the capacity to accommodate 140 computers. In addition a 60 capacity digital classroom is also situated at the second floor, equipped with 60 desktop computers. There are two lifts with braille button and two staircases in the building. The building is fully air conditioned and equipped with a fire fighting system. Each floor consists of modern toilet facilities for male, female and differently abled persons. The building is barrier free.

B. Multipurpose Indoor Hall with sports facility







The construction of a multipurpose indoor hall, with Sports Facility has been completed in the month of October 2020. The building is a single storey dome-like structure strolling across 17,500 square feet. There is a stage, sized 36 feet X 24 feet on one side and a gallery on the other. There are green room facilities on either side of the stage, with toilet facilities for both male and female. There is a VIP lounge inside the hall, with an attached toilet and pantry. There are two badminton courts, with synthetic flooring and two sets of Table Tennis Boards inside the hall. There are separate changing rooms with toilet facilities for both male and female players. There is sufficient lighting facilities for sporting as well as meeting purposes. There is an additional sound system also for meeting purposes.

C. Canteen Building.

The construction of the canteen building is nearing completion. The canteen building is an Assam type structure of 3000 square feet area. The canteen building is modelled as a cafeteria, with 100 seating capacity. Installation of 04 nos. of stalls is proposed, inside the cafeteria. There are separate toilet facilities for male and female. The building is barrier free.

7.2. UPCOMING PROJECTS

Second phase of campus infrastructure development has been taken up with the approval of Government of Assam and financial assistance of Rs. 46 crores sanctioned by the same. In this phase of construction, following buildings have been proposed:

- 300 Bed Student Hostel
- Vice-Chancellor's Residence and
- Teachers' Residential Quarters.

The Public Works Department has completed the tender procedure and construction work is likely to commence shortly.

8. ACTIVITIES AND AMENITIES OF IT SECTION

8.1 ONLINE LEARNING AND TEACHING FACILITY

As the lockdown was imposed due to Covid-19 pandemic, the challenge was to deliver and maintain momentum of the teaching and learning activities; the IT Section, NLUJA, Assam had to play its role. In this regard, Google Classroom and Google Meet were adopted for online teaching and learning. The online classrooms for different semesters and batches were created and also tutorial videos were developed on using the Google Classroom and Meet applications. With these online facilities, the faculty members are not only delivering lectures but also are able to conduct mock tests, class tests, end to end interactions with students and other academic activities.

8.2 DIGITAL LIBRARY



A digital classroom has been set up on the 2nd floor of the library building. For this, 60 nos. of high end computer systems were procured and installed, along with projector and screen. This classroom would be used as a language lab and also for conducting various training programmes.

Another Computer Lab, with 70 computer systems, has been set up for the use of the students, faculty and staff members of the University, on the 2nd floor of the library building.

8.3. UPGRADATION AND RENEWAL OF SERVICES

- Redhat Enterprise Linux service subscription was renewed for another year.
- Google GSuite Enterprise for Education licence was subscribed for one year.

8.4. ONLINE ADMISSION PROCESS

The Online Admission System developed by IT Section was implemented to facilitate admission of candidates, who have qualified the CLAT, 2020, to the UG and PG Programmes at NLUJA, Assam.

8.5. ORIENTATION PROGRAMMES / WORKSHOPS




9.1.1 Student strength, with category wise break-up of seats of the students admitted to the Undergraduate Course

II-Year: 9th Batch (2019-24)



III-Year: 8th Batch (2018-23)



IV-Year : 7th Batch (2017-22)



9.1.2 Commencement of Academic Session

Academic Session 2020-2021 commenced on September 1, 2020. The students were provided with syllabus and course materials which have been prepared by the faculty members and uploaded in the National Law University and Judicial Academy Intranet Portal.

9.1.3 Admissions (2020-2021)

During the period under report, admission for the eighth batch of the Undergraduate Course was held through the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT-2020). The online examination was conducted by the Consortium of National Law Universities. More than 50,000 candidates appeared for the online test. Out of the successful candidates 60 (Sixty) students took admission in the B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) Five Year Integrated Course at National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam.

9.1.4 Orientation Programme, 2020

An Online Orientation Programme was held for the newly admitted students and their parents/guardians. The programme was presided over by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor (I/C), Smt. Aparna Ajitsaria, AJS. 12.1 CENTRE FOR GENDER JUSTICE



A. Regional Consultation on Female Labour Force Participation in India: National Commission for Women (NCW) and V. V. Giri National Labour Institute in collaboration with Centre for Gender Justice, NLUJA, Assam organised Regional Consultation on Female Labour Force Participation in India on February 06, 2020.

Within the South Asian context, India has witnessed a decline in the female labour force participation (LFP) which has been a matter of serious concern or policy makers, planners, gender advocates and scholars working in this area. The female LFP was recorded as 34.1 per cent in 1999-00 which declined to 27.2 per cent in 2011-12 as per the National Sample Survey Organisation. The recently released Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) for 2017-18 reported a further decline in female labour force participation in usual status (ps+ss) in 15 years and above age group which was 23.3 percent for females while for males it was 75.8 percent. In rural areas female labour force participation in this age group was 24.6 percent while for males it was 76.4 percent. In urban areas, LFP was 20.4 percent for females and 74.5 percent for males. In rural areas nearly one-fourth of the females of

age 15 years and above were in the labour force while in among urban females of age 15 years and above, nearly one-fifth were in the labour force (GoI,2019)[1]. While on one hand, the employment trends for women in India have been discouraging, on the other hand, women's participation in domestic duties has increased which is again an important area of concern. According to a recent report of the National Sample Survey Organisation on 'Participation of Women in Specified Activities Along With Domestic Duties' 2014, the domestic duties participation for women in rural areas has increased from 53.4 percent in 2004-2005 to 61.6 in 2011-12. While is urban areas it has remained constant at 65.0 percent (GoI, 2014)[2]. Further, time-use surveys of 26 OECD countries and three OECD enhanced engagement countries (China, India and South Africa) show that women devote, on average, more than twice as much time to household work as men (OECD 2012)[3].

In this background, the National Commission for Women in collaboration with the V.V.Giri National Labour Institute proposed to conduct five regional consultations on matters relating to working women, especially those in the unorganized sector to understand the factors affecting female labour force participation. The regional consultations were held in Cuttack, Guwahati, Bengaluru, Gandhinagar and Delhi in collaboration with respective National Law Universities (NLUs). The regional consultations deliberated on issues related to women's participation in the labour market and the constraints which women face to continue in paid employment. The attempt was to understand the relationship between female labour force participation (FLFP) with informality, unpaid care work, gender based violence including workplace harassment, marriage, socio-cultural norms, social protection, labour regulations etc. The consultations brought to light a range of factors with a focus on region specific factors affecting women's paid work and highlighted the necessary policy interventions/action plans that need to be undertaken at a regional level for addressing the issues related to declining female labour force participation.

Objectives:

- To understand employment trends for women in India and factors responsible for declining female LFP.
- To explore the inter-relationship of crimes against women, gender based violence, workplace harassment, issues of safety, security and dignity of women with FLFP

- To understand the impact of marriage, pregnancy, child birth, child care and other care responsibilities of women on FLFP.
- To understand the issues of women in the unorganized sector and identify the impact of prevailing laws on FLFP.
- To understand the challenges of women in transition from informal to formal sector and the specific scenarios prevailing in these sectors vis a vis women in STEM and in position of higher responsibility.
- To provide a platform for sharing of good practices from national/regional and statelevel experiences addressing FLFP.
- To develop a set of recommendations for informing policy and programme to address
 declining female labour force participation across sectors and identify action plans to
 counter and mitigate them at the regional level.
- B. Regional Consultation on Reviewing Laws Related to Inter-State Women Migrant Workers: National Commission for Women (NCW) in collaboration with Centre for Gender Justice, NLUJA, Assam organised Regional Consultation on Reviewing Laws Related to Inter-State Women Migrant Workers on June 19, 2020.

COVID-19 epidemic has affected many countries and the World Health Organization has declared it 'Pandemic'. Government of India (GOI) has been taking several proactive preventive and mitigating measures to contain the spread of this virus early on. The Announcement of 21-day national lockdown and its subsequent extension till 3rd May by the Hon'ble Prime Minister came in the wake of this outbreak to enable 'social distancing', an effective non-pharmaceutical prevention and control intervention. The far-sighted and unprecedented step of lockdown however saw a large scale movement of migrant workers across the country due to lack of livelihood, food, shelter and transport. This has brought forth problems faced by thousands of inter-state migrant workers, particularly women, and

NCW has initiated consultations at regional and national level to examine the legal framework for migrant workers and make suggestions so as to provide them prescribed minimum social security and welfare. India is established as a welfare state by the Constitution and is responsible for social security of its citizens through Directive Principle of State Policy. Article 39, 42 and 47 of the Constitution are dedicated to ensure social

security including appropriate healthcare, food, shelter and safety to its citizens especially women workers. Impact of migration on women in India has been largely un-assessed. They are, many a time, the primary wage earners of their families and make essential contributions to their family and society. National Commission for Women with its mandate to review legal and constitutional safeguards available to women; identify inadequacies and suggest remedial measures thereto, feels that it imperative to take up the cause of inter-state migrant women workers and ensure that their rights are secured.

Need for Consultation and Outcomes Expected

- Assessing ways in which the present legal framework relating to Inter State Migrant Workers can be made more gender aware.
- Identifying Inadequacies in the present legal framework and suggesting remedial measures so as to improve the condition of inter-state migrant workers as a whole and women migrant workers in particular.
- Gathering information related to the present status of implementation of provisions relating to wage payments, displacement allowance, journey allowance, crèche, medical facilities, health services and anti-sexual harassment and measures to improve effectiveness for women workers.
- Reviewing the ISMW Act along with other beneficial legislations to understand inconsistencies and whether the new 2019 Code is an improvement over it as regards welfare of women.
- Understanding the nature of migrant women workers in Indian labour workforce so that different issues related to different groups are addressed.
- Devising ways to mainstream migrant women workers in developmental plans and programmes.

This endeavour aimed at cultivating the spirit of social service among the NSS volunteers and at creating a dynamic modality of reaching out to the impoverished and the needy.




